What Happened in Indiana? Did Religious Freedom Jump the Shark?



Professor Winnifred Fallers Sullivan, Chair of Religious Studies Department and Affiliate Professor of the Maurer College of Law, Indiana University, will deliver the keynote address for a conference devoted to “Freedom of (and from) Religion: Debates Over the Accommodation of Religion in the Public Sphere,” being held May 1-2, in Flying A Room, University Center, UC Santa Barbara. She is the co-editor of *After Secular Law*, *Varieties of Religious Establishment* and, most recently, *Politics of Religious Freedom*.
